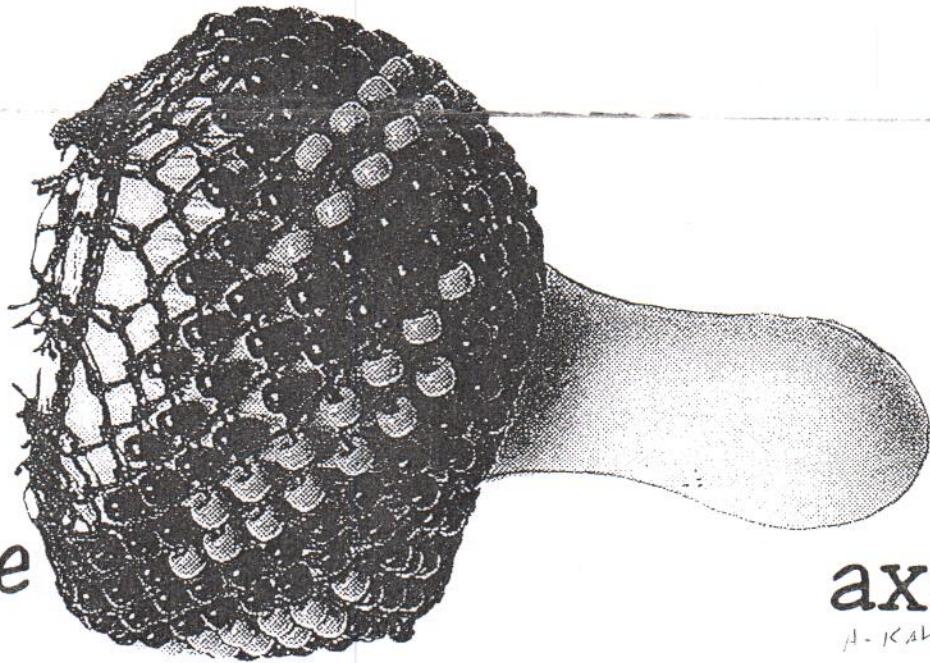

Formerly a British colony, Ghana was the first black African colony to receive independence, on March 6, 1957. The capital city of Accra is located on the southern coast. Much of Ghana is lowlands, with a sandy beach coast, plains, and saltwater lagoons. One third of the country is a forested area that produces cacao (used in making chocolate) and timber. The climate is tropical, with humid air in the southern rain forests and hot, dry air in the northern grassy savannas. The Volta River system dominates the country. The major peoples (among 75 ethnic groups) include the Akan, Ewe, and Ga. English is the official language taught in the schools.
